Subject: Invitation to Attend the Open House for Dominion Transmission, Inc. 's
Proposed Natural Gas Compressor Station

Good Morning,

Carolyn Moss has asked me to send you the following letter announcing an
Open House for Dominion's proposed natural gas compressor station.

Thank you.

Through an email dated April 3, 2008, I advised you that in response to
requests from various Frederick County elected officials and community
organizations concerned with the proposed location of a natural gas
compressor station on property along Marker Road (the "Marker Road Site"),
Dominion Transmission, Inc. (DTI) had conducted a second investigation of
possible alternative locations for the proposed natural gas compressor
station. DTI has selected a site located along US. Route 340 and MD Rt.
180 (Jefferson Pike), approximately 2 miles southwest of Jefferson (the
"Rt. 340/180 Site"). The purpose of this letter is to invite you and nearby
landowners to join us for an Open House to discuss preliminary details
about the proposed facility. The Open House will be held on Wednesday, May
7, 2008 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM, at Valley Elementary School, located at
3519 Jefferson Pike, Jefferson, Maryland 21755.

DTI's 30 inch PL-1 natural gas transmission pipeline, which extends from
Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, through Frederick County, Maryland and on to
Leesburg, Virginia, is an important link in the regional natural gas
transmission system, providing critical natural gas supply to help
stabilize energy costs for homes and businesses in the Mid-Atlantic region,
including Frederick County, and in the Northeast/New England region. To
meet the growing demand for natural gas, Dominion has proposed a large
storage factory project in Tioga County, Pennsylvania. To ensure
continuous and reliable delivery of natural gas from the Pennsylvania
storage factory to customers in Maryland, Dominion must construct a new gas
compressor station somewhere along the PL-1 pipeline's midpoint between
Chambersburg and Leesburg, which falls in Frederick County.

In response to community feedback on the Marker Road Site, DTI has instead begun focusing on the Rt. 340/180 Site as a viable alternative location for the proposed natural gas compressor station. The Rt. 340/180 Site is located approximately 1.9 miles southwest of Jefferson and is bounded to the north and east by Route 180 (Jefferson Pike), to the south and east by US Route 340 and to the west by Gene Hemp Road. Because the Rt. 340/180 Site is immediately adjacent to DTI's existing Jefferson Metering and Regulation natural gas transmission facility, it is responsive to the desires of Frederick County elected officials and community groups that such facilities be co-located with similar existing utility uses. Additionally, because the Rt. 340/180 Site is located outside the Rural Legacy Program area, it is responsive to the desires of Frederick County elected officials and community groups that utility facilities avoid locating in culturally sensitive areas, whenever possible.

The selection of Rt. 340/180 Site reflects Dominion's commitment to the concerns of the citizens of Frederick County and their elected officials and its commitment to provide reliable utility service. Dominion is proud to be a corporate citizen of Maryland and is committed to helping meet the energy needs of the state and the region.
